

ELEMENTARY, MIDDLE, AND HIGH SCHOOL YOUNG AUTHORS' CONTEST EXPECTATIONS FOR STUDENTS/TEACHERS/PARENTS 2020-2021

2020-2021

ELIGIBILITY:

Students in **Grades 1 through 12** are eligible to enter a previously unsubmitted short story and/or poem written within the previous or current school year. Each entry may have only one author and only one entry per author may be submitted for each category.

CONTEST GUIDELINES:

ENTRIES MUST BE THE STUDENT'S ORIGINAL WORK.

- Peers or adults may provide editing assistance (spelling, punctuation, etc.), but revisions should be student-generated and the final product must be the student's own work.
- All entries must be submitted in a **Microsoft Word file** with no less than **12 point Times New Roman** font.
- Each short story entry must range between 100-400 words for grades 1-2; 300-800 words for grades 3-5; 600-1,600 words for grades 6-8; and 800-2,000 words for grades 9-12 submissions.
- Each poem entry will consist of a single poem which may be any style and must range **from 25-150 words** for elementary submissions and **25-300 words** for middle and high school submissions.
- All entries must include a **completed cover sheet** signed by the **parent**. <u>This should be submitted</u> as a separate PDF file. Parental verification may also be confirmed via a digital signature.

SELECTION CRITERIA:

- 1. Entry meets all of the above guidelines and is submitted by the due date.
- 2. Story reflects creative content and interesting use of language and short story structure.
- 3. Poem reflects creative content and application of poetic techniques.
- 4. Entry avoids bias against any group of people. Entry avoids extreme acts of sex and violence.

Any violation(s) of these guidelines or criteria will disqualify the entry. The decisions of the state judge panel are final.

WINNERS:

Each local literacy chapter will select **1 short story** and **1 poem per grade level** to submit to SoMLA's contest. The state Young Authors judges will then select a 1st and 2nd place winner per category at each grade level. A DIGITAL anthology of the winning entries will be made available on the SoMLA website, and a <u>virtual</u> celebration is anticipated for the spring of 2021.
